



Call for abstracts for presentations, posters, and workshops

Themes and Topics

- Nursing and midwifery practice innovations
 - Models of Care enhance patient outcomes and satisfaction.
 - Community-Centred Nursing and Midwifery Approaches include successful outreach programs, community health education campaigns, and collaborations with local stakeholders, community organisations, and advocacy groups to address health disparities, promote social justice, and advance anti-racism efforts in healthcare.
 - Leadership and Professional Development showcasing innovative leadership models, mentorship programs, and professional development initiatives fostering excellence and resilience among nursing and midwifery professionals.
- Conditions for success in the lifespan of a professional nursing and midwifery journey.
 - Cultural Safety and Anti-Racism Education and Training focuses on curriculum development, training programs, and continuing education initiatives to promote awareness of racism, privilege, and unconscious bias among nursing and midwifery students and professionals.
 - Workforce Well-being and Resilience focussing on factors that contribute to the well-being and resilience of nursing and midwifery professionals throughout their careers, including self-care practices, work-life balance, and strategies for managing stress and burnout.
 - Retirement and Legacy focusing on the transition to retirement and the legacy of nursing and midwifery professionals, including reflections on accomplishments, contributions to the profession, and opportunities for mentorship and knowledge sharing.
 - Advocacy and Policy Development focussing on advocacy efforts, policy recommendations, and legislative initiatives aimed at addressing systemic racism and promoting equity within healthcare systems and regulatory bodies

Guidelines

The following section outlines the general guidelines that are applicable to all abstract submissions:

- Abstracts should align with one or more of the conference topics.

- Abstracts must be received by the advertised closing date. Submissions received after this date will not be considered.
- All abstracts must be submitted electronically via the Conference portal.
- Abstract submissions must contain no more than 200 words (excluding title, including subheadings)
- First authors must be Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.
- Presenting authors must register and pay for their travel, accommodation, and expenses to attend the conference. No presenter fee is paid to successful presenters.
- Submissions will be subject to peer review by the Conference Scientific Committee.
- It is the responsibility of the presenter to ensure that the abstract is submitted correctly.

Key dates for abstract submissions and notifications

- Submissions open 10th June 2024
- Submissions close 30th August 2024
- Notify successful applicants 27th September 2024

About	Poster presentations visually display new techniques, programs, or research. Poster presentations will be displayed in the poster display area within the exhibition space for the duration of the conference.	This presentation involves the presenter(s) physically present to deliver a short verbal presentation (with slides) to the audience.	The interactive workshop actively engages participants and creates a rich and immersive learning experience to encourage active participation, collaboration, networking, and skill building.
Guidelines	Size: We recommend that posters are A0 size (120cm x 84cm) Content: Abstracts should include the following subheadings: • Title • Background • Methods • Results • Conclusion • Implications	Time: Each presenter will have 15 minutes to deliver their presentation, which will be followed by a live Q&A from the audience.	Time: Each workshop will be held for 45 – 60 minutes Content: Workshop presenters must provide an outline of the structure/plan for the session.
